


TALENT PIPELINE

The Greater Phoenix area is supported by a wealth of healthcare, research and academic medicine programs. The Valley boasts multiple community colleges and universities, graduate medical education training programs, nursing schools and specialty healthcare education offerings. Furthermore, it's estimated that 38% of residents hold an associate degree or higher. As a result, the landscape of Greater Phoenix is fitting for healthcare and biomedical research companies of virtually every size and scope.

- **Phoenix Biomedical Campus** is a 30-acre medical and bioscience campus in downtown Phoenix with an estimated \$1.3 billion annual economic impact.

- The University of Arizona College of Medicine Phoenix, A.T. Still University and Mayo Clinic are among the Valley's medical school offerings.
